The Powerful Love that sings the ever expanding universe into being and provides the music to which every sub-atomic particle dances, was born in Jesus who showed us that when we love God and love all that God has made, we enter into the song and dance of creation.

Tonight as we lift our voices in prayer and praise

we join with angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim, and everything else in the unobservable universe, we join with our sun and moon and all the stars in the observable universe,

we join with land and sea, fire and wind, plants and animals, and every child of every time and every place to celebrate the One who has both the power to create all that is and the love to care about you and me.

Tonight we are here to celebrate a mystery, a God too big to even imagine who loved us enough to come down to our size, to the size of a baby, a gift of love small enough for Mary and Joseph to hold in their arms.

We are here tonight to celebrate God's gift of love that's small enough to live in our hearts and yet big enough to change our world.
