We are all so grateful! Genesis is grateful to be sharing space with Salem for worship this summer as their parking lot is no longer available during their worship time. Salem is grateful for the use of Genesis' portable sound system for our outdoor worship and for the technical help of Jeanette and her son, Lonnell Lawson, for running the system. Salem is also grateful for the use of 2 different sets of sound equipment belonging to New Direction Ministries – 1 set for our drive-in service, and 1 set for our prerecorded services – and for Pastor Simmonds' continuing help in setting it up.

Summer Worship through Labor Day for Salem and for Genesis will be at 9:30 in the Picnic Grove, weather permitting. If light or moderate rain, we'll have a drive-in service. If a serious storm, we'll meet online via Zoom. No matter what the format we use for the rest of the summer or the fall, we plan to stream via Facebook Live. On Sundays where the service is pre-recorded in the sanctuary it will also be streamed on YouTube. If you can't watch at 9:30 Sundays, video worship services will be saved to Facebook and posted on YouTube so you can watch them later. Closed Captioning will be provided when available. Ebony and Ivory? Wonder why some of your friends are saying “Black Lives Matter” when obviously all lives matter? Wonder why when we have anti-racism laws, people keep talking about “systemic” or “structural racism”? Wonder why the church is so focused on this issue? 1. **Read the 2019 Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent** & its accompanying Explanation at http://download.elca.org/ELCA%20Resource%20Repository/Slavery_Apology_Explanation.pdf?ga=2.119362624.853575714.1565027421-1958052405.1536241629 or go to ELCA.org, scroll down to “Resources”, scroll down to “Racial Justice”, and click on the Declaration to read and/or download.
2. **Listen to this video lecture** by Tom Skinner: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bvKQx4ycTmA>. It gives a much more detailed history of slavery in this country than we ever received in our history classes at school, and explains how it was the issue of slavery that created the divide between mainline and evangelical Christians.
3. **Join the Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport for the last two weeks of an insightful series**, “The Color of Compromise”, every other Thursday evening this summer (8/13 and 8/27) from 7:30-9:00 as we watch enlightening video clips and engage in meaningful discussion. The book and series outlines the history of how the American churches helped create and continue to maintain racist ideas and practices and outlines the kind of bold action needed to forge a future of equality and justice, including concrete solutions for improved race relations in a racially inclusive church. 4. **Read the book, Dear Church: a Love Letter from a Black Preacher to the Whitest Denomination in the US** by Lenny Duncan. There have been many explanations for the church’s decline, but Duncan sees a direct correlation between the church’s lack of diversity and its lack of vitality. Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter, Dear Church offers a bold new vision for the future of the ELCA and the rest of mainline Protestant Christianity and calls everyone – leaders and laity alike – to the front lines of the church’s renewal through racial equality and justice. *Salem has a few copies of the book, so if you would like to borrow one, please speak with Pastor Marjo.*

COMMEMORATION FOR THE WEEK

Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258

Monday, August 10, 2020

As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome,

Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor.

Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253

Tuesday, August 11, 2020

A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions

established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares.

She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.

Florence Nightingale, died 1910; Clara Maass, died 1901; renewers of society **Thursday, August 13, 2020**

Nightingale was born in England, and horrified her wealthy family by deciding to become a nurse.

She led a group of nurses in ministering in the midst of the Crimean War, and worked for hospital reform.

Maass, a native of New Jersey, was also a war nurse, and volunteered as a subject for research on yellow fever.

She died of the disease.

Maximilian Kolbe, died 1941; Kaj Munk, died 1944; martyrs

Friday, August 14, 2020

Father Kolbe was a Franciscan priest arrested by the Nazis and confined in Auschwitz.

Kolbe gave generously of his meager resources,

and finally volunteered to be starved to death in place of another man.

A Danish Lutheran pastor and playwright,

Munk strongly denounced the Nazis who occupied Denmark in the Second World War.

His sermons and articles helped to show the anti-Christian nature of the movement.

Mary, Mother of Our Lord

Saturday, August 15, 2020

The church (including Martin Luther) honored Mary with the title theotokos, meaning "God-bearer", for her role in giving birth to the Son of God.

Her song, the Magnificat, speaks eloquently of God's lifting the lowly and feeding the hungry.


