Perpetua and Felicity and companions, martyrs at Carthage, died 202

03/07/21

Vibia Perpetua was a noblewoman, and Felicity her slave, were catechumens at Carthage, northern Africa.

They, with four other catechumens, had defied the Roman emperor who had forbidden conversions to Christianity, and were put to death in the amphitheater.

Harriet Tubman, died 1913; Sojourner Truth, died 1883; renewers of society

03/10/21

Harriet Tubman, born into slavery, helped about 300 others to escape slavery until the institution was abolished.

Sojourner Truth, whose birth name was Isabella, was freed after slavery was abolished, and discerned a call to be a preacher.

Taking the name Sojourner Truth, she set out on an evangelistic journey, where people found her testimony to be deeply moving.

Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome, died 604

03/12/21

Born into wealth and power, Gregory was for a time the chief administrator of the city of Rome.

Giving this up for a life in the church, he was elected pope in 590.

He influenced public worship through the establishment of a lectionary and prayers to correlate with the readings. Gregorian chant is named in his honor.
