# Gathering

**Welcome!**

**Council has decided to move worship back indoors as the weather is growing cooler.** It was also decided that if you are fully vaccinated, a mask is recommended but not mandatory inside. If you are immune-compromised and fully vaccinated, a mask is strongly recommended inside. If you are not fully vaccinated, a mask must be worn inside. **Although Council voted to not require masks, Pastor Marjo asks that you please wear one.** **Despite the fact that she was vaccinated just 6 months ago, is younger than most of the congregation, in excellent health, and is pretty cautious about wearing her mask, she ended up with a breakthrough infection and was sick for 12 days. Although the vaccine kept her from being seriously ill, she could have easily transmitted the virus to someone who was not vaccinated and that person could have ended up being hospitalized or even dying. Thank God that did not happen. Soft singing of hymns will be permitted BUT PLEASE SING ONLY IF YOU ARE WEARING A MASK.** While we know not everyone will be happy with this decision, please understand that whether it's about indoors vs. outdoors, masks vs. no masks, singing vs. no singing, there is simply no way we can please everyone. As Christians, however, it is our call to put aside our own preferences and focus not on our own desires, but on what God asks of us – which is to provide a place where even the most vulnerable in our midst feel safe. We have too many attendees with comorbidities and too many who are in contact with unvaccinated grandchildren to be less than cautious. Thank you for your understanding and your support.

## **UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS**

**Clement, Bishop of Rome, died around 100** **Tuesday, November 23, 2021**

Clement was the third bishop of Rome.

He is best remembered for a letter he wrote to the congregation in Corinth, still struggling with the same problems that led to Paul's letters to them.

As did Paul, he focused on the need for love among Christians.

**Miguel Agustín Pro, martyr, died 1927** **Tuesday, November 23, 2021**

Pro grew up in a time when the Mexican revolutionaries accused the church of siding with the wealthy.

He became a Jesuit priest, and worked on behalf of the poor and homeless.

Falsely accused of throwing a bomb at a government official, he was executed, but not before crying out "Long live Christ the King!"

**Justus Falckner, died 1723; Jehu Jones, died 1852; William Passavant, died 1894;**  
**pastors in North America**

**Wednesday, November 24, 2021**

Not only was Falckner the first Lutheran ordained in North America, but he published a catechism which was the first Lutheran book published on the continent.

Jones was the Lutheran church's first African American pastor and carried out missionary work in Philadelphia

which led to the formation there of the 1<sup>st</sup> African American Lutheran congregation (St. Paul's).

William Passavant helped to establish hospitals and orphanages in a number of cities

and was the first to introduce deaconesses to the work of hospitals in the United States.

**Isaac Watts, hymnwriter, died 1748** **Thursday, November 25, 2021**

Thought by many to be the greatest hymnwriter in the English language,

Watts as a youth was critical of the quality of the metrical psalter of the time.

He wrote about 600 hymns—many based on the psalms, but others that are not.
