

Word

A READING FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT: Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

After these things the word of God came to Abram in a vision, "Do not be afraid, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great". But Abram said, "O Lord God, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" And Abram said, "You have given me no offspring, and so a slave born in my house is to be my heir". But the word of God came to him, "This man shall not be your heir; no one but your very own issue shall be your heir". God brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able to count them". Then he said to him, "So shall your descendants be." And he believed God, and God reckoned it to him as righteousness.

Then God said to him, "I am the God who brought you from Ur of the Chaldeans, to give you this land to possess". But Abram said, "O Lord God, how am I to know that I shall possess it?" Though the Bible tells us little about the husband of Jesus' mother Mary, we know that he was a carpenter or builder by trade. He is also shown as being devoted both to God and to Mary and Jesus. It is assumed that he died before Jesus became an adult.
