Welcome

Today we celebrate the Trinity. While God manifests in countless ways to us, Paul found it made sense to focus on three ways when he wrote that through *Jesus* we have peace with *God*, whose love pours into our hearts through the *Holy Spirit*, giving us lasting hope. Over the years this became the traditional way for Christians to describe the mystery of a God that is all about relationships. Today we celebrate the eternal One-in-Three and Three-in-One, as we worship in community, being drawn deeper into relationship with this Triune God, and at the same time being drawn deeper into relationship with each other, with other members of the Church, with all other children of God, and with the world God has made.

Salem is still recommending masks, especially for singing. We know that some are only comfortable coming into a place where people are masked, and we want to provide an environment where everyone feels safe. Case numbers are rising and the latest variant is even more contagious than Omicron and its successor. While the current variants may cause only mild symptoms in most people, those who are older and who have underlying conditions remain at risk for more serious illness, including long Covid. There is also a 20% chance of even a mild case of Covid developing into more serious long Covid. We will continue to re-evaluate based on what happens with the pandemic and what the latest advice is concerning singing protocols.

The Color of Compromise: Sacred Conversations on Race and the American Church. The Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport's Raising the BAR (Becoming Anti-Racist) team invites you into sacred conversations in a safe space to talk about the history of race and the American Church. Though the series will span 11 weeks, each session covers a distinct topic, so you're welcome to attend as many as you wish. Guided by the book *The Color of Compromise*, a video series by its author, Jemar Tisby, and the CCGB's capable and dedicated team of facilitators, the series moves chronologically from America's colonial past to today's Black Lives Matter movement. *The Color of Compromise* is not about shaming or blaming but rather opens our eyes to a history hidden, unknown, or ignored by White Christians and calls us to take seriously what the Bible teaches about human dignity and equality. As members of the whitest denomination in the US, this is an opportunity for those of us at Salem to learn and grow. The remaining sessions will cover "Compromising with Racism during the Civil Rights Movement" (June 16); "Organizing the Religious Right at the End of the Twentieth Century" (June 23); "Reconsidering Racial Reconciliation in the Age of Black Lives Matter" (June 30) and "The Fierce Urgency of Now" (July 7). CT CityFest is a region-wide movement focused on serving the region and proclaiming the Good News. It came about as a result of years of prayer and planning by dozens of leaders in Fairfield and New Haven Counties and the surrounding Southwestern Connecticut area. The vision is to see the Christian community come together in greater unity, service, and proclamation – showing the community the joy, peace, and love of Jesus Christ. Over 130 churches and ministries have already committed to share hope and love through this movement which is focused on encouraging unity and collaboration across all communities, denominations, and ethnicities. Most impressively, this collaborative effort spans both the racial divide as well as the divides between Evangelicals & Mainline Protestants & Roman Catholics. Together, as the Body of Christ, we want to celebrate & accelerate the work of the Church, helping further influence culture, change lives, & inspire other cities.

CityFest has already begun with the launch of **CityServe**, a massive effort to mobilize churches to serve our region's greatest needs, providing support for those needing Adoption & Foster Care, better Education, and freedom from Food Insecurity. It will culminate with a series of outreach events strategically designed to share the love of Jesus with key groups of people in our community, including university students, business/civic leaders, women, and those who are incarcerated.

Clementa C. Pinckney, Cynthia Marie Graham Hurd, Susie Jackson, Ethel Lee Lance,

DePayne Middleton-Doctor, Tywanza Sanders, Daniel Lee Simmons,

Sharonda Coleman-Singleton, and Myra Thompson

were murdered by a self-professed white supremacist

while they were gathered for Bible study and prayer

at the Emanuel African Methodist Episcopal Church (often referred to as Mother Emanuel)

in Charleston, South Carolina.

Pastors Pinckney and Simmons were both graduates

of the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary.

A resolution to commemorate June 17 as a day of repentance

for the martyrdom of the Emanuel Nine was adopted by the Churchwide Assembly

of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America on August 8, 2019.

Congregations of the ELCA are encouraged reaffirm their commitment

to repenting of the sins of racism and white supremacy which continue to plague this church,

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Be part of a HUGE community of people walking for Calumet by signing up for Walk the Walk 2022.

It's easy! Everyone who registers (dogs are welcome, too) joins a TEAM. Lots of Congregations will have their own Congregation TEAMS (last year, there were about 70 congregations TEAMS). One person from the congregation will serve as TEAM Captain collecting miles periodically from all the TEAM Members ... and then the Captain will report the total miles of the whole TEAM to Calumet. It is wicked easy.



A Calumet TEAM might be a good option for people who aren't connected to a congregation. There are many fun options available. There are lots of great Calumet TEAMS like TEAM Campfire, TEAM Outdoor Chapel, TEAM Ice Cream Social, TEAM Jackman Ridge, and more. See the list when you register and pick a TEAM that seems like it's a good fit for you.

Each TEAM will have a Captain. We hope those serving as TEAM Captains in 2021 will volunteer to do it again. Congregations organizing a TEAM for Walk the Walk 2022 will want to identify one person who can serve as Captain. It's not a wicked hard job, by any means. But it's best if the Captain is good at sending, checking, and reading their emails.

During the summer you'll be contacted by your TEAM Captain who will ask you, "Hey, I'm going to report our TEAM's mileage so far this summer. How many miles have you logged?" TEAM members will be expected to log their miles four times throughout the 62 days of July and August. Mileage from July 1-15 will be submitted to Captains beginning on July 16. Mileage from July 16-31 will be submitted beginning August 1. Mileage trekked between August 1-15 will be shared with the Captain starting on August 16. And miles from August 16-31 will get to the Captain on September 1.

As the summer progresses, Calumet will hear from TEAM Captains who will be able to report their TEAM's mileage through a wicked easy Google Form (thanks to Amy Gillam O'Riley for her awesome leadership with this). Calumet will share the growing mileage total all summer long. The goal: 350,000 miles by the end of the day on August 31!

Calumet has a special Walk the Walk Facebook page which participants all over the place are invited to join. Though out the summer, there will be daily devotions, fun contests, photo sharing, and more. This Facebook group has been a fantastic way for people to get to know one another. We have a specific group of people led by Pat Mahoney with the job of managing the page and encouraging awesome connections – a la Calumet Nation!

Registration Starts on May 15, 2022! The registration fee is a \$25 donation to Calumet.


