Today is the third Sunday of Advent, which means we are beginning week 3 of our new church year! In our 3-year lectionary (cycle of Bible readings), this is year A, the year that we focus on the gospel of Matthew.

A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us in our hearts and lives, in praise and worship, in Bible study and prayer, in our homes and in the world, and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us that we might "go and tell" the world what we have heard and seen God say and do!

ADVENT WREATH CANDLELIGHTING - 3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT - JOY

The wreath is of course a circle - reminding us of the perfection and eternity of God.

Many wreaths are decorated with evergreen branches.

The evergreen, like the circle, is a symbol of eternity - but also of life.

Holly is sometimes used instead of - or with - the evergreen.

The sharp points of the leaves of the Holly remind us of Christ's crown of thorns.

The red berries remind us of his blood.

There is a story that holly berries were white until Christ's blood fell on them – causing them to be red ever since.

Christ is, of course, the light of the world – hence the candles.

Help us to be ready for the time of Christ's appearing.


Fix our hearts and our minds upon those things you have done

John of the Cross, renewer of the church, died 1591 Wednesday, December 14, 2022

John was a member of the Carmelite monastic order, and worked to reform it. His writings reflect a deep interest in mystical thought and meditation.

Las Posadas

Friday, December 16, 2022

This celebration, long popular in Mexico, takes its name from the "posadas," or lodgings, sought by Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem.

Their search is reenacted in a neighborhood, unsuccessfully, until finally they are welcomed in, and a party commences.

(CHiPS) in Brooklyn, which serves as many as 175 meals daily through their soup kitchen and food pantry. Earlier she served as the executive director of Jeremiah Program's community in the Brownsville neighborhood in Brooklyn, overseeing their efforts to provide support for mothers and children. Annan also served as a pastor in a congregation in New Jersey and as the assistant director of St. John Residence and School for Boys in Rockaway Park, N.Y.

The Rev. Shivonne Annan will assume her duties with the Council of Churches early 2023, replacing Tom Larson, who currently serves as interim president and CEO.
