Welcome

We want you to feel safe so please know that we have 3 units of the best air cleaner on the market in the sanctuary. And we also have one running here in the lounge where we are worshipping today and next Sunday. Also, you are most welcome to wear a mask at worship if you'd like.

How is your life different from your non-Christian friend's? For those who love God with all their heart, who listen intently each and every day to what God is saying, and who obey God even when it seems crazy or risky or even scary to do so, there is a huge difference. Today's first reading from Deuteronomy calls us to choose the way of life – not simply for ourselves, but for the world. Paradoxically, to choose this kind of life may lead through the cross and death before we are raised to new life. In our second lesson Paul reminds us that leaders in the church are not the ones who should be in control of the ministry and future of the church, but rather are called to submit to God's will and authority, and to do whatever it is that God asks, no matter how foolish or counterintuitive it may seem. In our gospel Jesus reminds us how much God loves us and therefore how much we can trust God, even when everything around us tells us to trust in ourselves.

A zoom meeting for all Salem members and members of other Lutheran congregations in Greater Bridgeport and beyond will be hosted by our synod on Sunday February 19th at 3:00 for the purpose of hearing from pastors and lay people who have made different decisions regarding their congregation's future – from continuing as they are, to having 2 congregations die to be raised as a new congregation, to having a smaller congregation absorbed into a larger one, to simply closing. After the 30-40 minutes presentation there will be time for questions.

A READING FROM THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES: Deuteronomy 30:15-20

See, I have set before you today life and prosperity, death and adversity. If you obey the commandments of YHWH your God that I am commanding you today, by loving YHWH your God, walking in his ways, and observing his commandments, decrees, and ordinances, then you shall live and become numerous, and YHWH your God will bless you in the land that you are entering to possess. A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: 1 Corinthians 3:10-11, 16-23

According to the grace of God given to me, like a skilled master builder I laid a foundation, and someone else is building on it. Each builder must choose with care how to build on it. For no one can lay any foundation other than the one that has been laid; that foundation is Jesus Christ.

Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person. For God's temple is holy, and you are that temple. Do not deceive yourselves. If you think that you are wise in this age, you should become fools so that you may become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness with God. For it is written, "He catches the wise in their craftiness", and again, "God knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are futile".

So let no one boast about human leaders. For all things are yours, whether Paul or Apollos or Cephas or the world or life or death or the present or the future — all belong to you, and you belong to Christ, and Christ belongs to God.

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS: Matthew 6:24-34 You may stand if you so desire.

"No one can serve two masters; for a slave will either hate the one and love the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and wealth.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you — you of little faith? Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.

"So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Cyril, monk, died 869; Methodius, bishop, died 885; missionaries to the Slavs Tuesday, February 14, 2023

These two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.

Martin Luther, renewer of the church, died 1546 Saturday, February 18, 2023

Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Protestant Reformation. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.
