Welcome to Worship!

We want you to feel safe so please know that we have 3 units of the best air cleaner on the market in the sanctuary. And we also have one running here in the lounge for when we have coffee hour or adult forums there. Also, you are most welcome to wear a mask at worship if you'd like.

The 4th Sunday of the 7-week Easter Season (a week of weeks!) is celebrated as "Good Shepherd Sunday". Every year on this Sunday we read the 23rd Psalm. And every year we have a reading from the 10th chapter of the gospel of John (year A–vss 1-10, year B–vss 11-18, and year C–vss 22-30). God's deepest desire has always been that his children love him with all of their hearts, minds, souls & bodies, but sin has separated us from God and cut us off from the riches God wants to supply, So God sent Jesus to model for us how we are to live, and through his crucifixion, resurrection, and ascension he has opened the Door to a whole new kind of life. As we walk through that door we discover something beyond ordinary human existence – an extraordinary abundant life that comes through the inpouring and transforming work of the Holy Spirit.

Our Wednesday Evening Bible Study has resumed. the time has been changed to 7:00 to accommodate some other Salem members. Inspired by the book, <u>Basic Christian Leadership</u>: <u>Biblical Models of Church, Gospel and Ministry</u> by John Stott, we have begun a study of 1 Corinthians 1-4, As you may know, Paul wrote to congregations who were facing challenges just as we are facing in the church today, and so we will be listening to how God is speaking to Salem and the church at large through Paul's words. This week we'll be reflecting on with 1 Corinthians 2. If you are interested in Salem's future, we do hope you will take this opportunity to join us!

The JOURNEY continues! How did your Lenten disciplines go? Maybe you did well, maybe you did so-so, and maybe you failed miserably – or maybe your results were mixed. Whatever your success or failure, remember that the purpose was to establish NEW healthier habits of body, mind, heart and soul. And that's an ongoing task. If you've done well, continue! If you haven't, well, you've got 7 weeks of Easter to try again! And so, you can still...

A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: 1 Peter 2:19-25

It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.

"He committed no sin, and no deceit was found in his mouth."

When he was abused, he did not return abuse; when he suffered, he did not threaten; but he entrusted himself to the one who judges justly. He himself bore our sins in his body on the cross, so that, free from sins, we might live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed. For you were going astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the shepherd and guardian of your souls.

A READING FROM THE GOSPELS: John 10:1-10 You may stand if you so desire.

[Jesus said:] "Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

Affirmation of Baptism

Please be seated.

PRESENTATION

Those making affirmation and their sponsors may gather with the minister at the font.

Dear friends, we give thanks for the gift of baptism and for this person, one with us in the body of Christ, who is making public affirmation of her baptism.

Those making affirmation are presented by a sponsor.

Sponsor: We present Rachel Cake Elie who desires to make public affirmation of her baptism.

Let us pray.

Merciful God, we thank you for this sister,

whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism.

You have called her to yourself, enlightened her with the gifts of your Spirit,

and nourished her in the community of faith.

Uphold your servant in the gifts and promises of baptism,

and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth.

We ask this in the name of Christ. **Amen**

PROFESSION OF FAITH

You may stand if you so desire.

I ask you, Cake, and all of you who are gathered here, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? I renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God? I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen

AFFIRMATION

The presiding minister addresses those making public affirmation of baptism.

You have made public profession of your faith.

Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

to live among God's faithful people,

to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,

to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,

to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,

and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

The minister addresses the assembly.

People of God, do you promise to support this sister and pray for her in her life in Christ? We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

Those making affirmation may kneel. The presiding minister prays for God's blessing. Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

LORD'S PRAYER

Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Thursday, May 4, 2023


Monica was married to a pagan husband who was ill-tempered and unfaithful, but whom she helped bring into the Christian faith.
