# Welcome to Worship!

We want you to feel safe so please know that we have 3 units of the best air cleaner on the market in the sanctuary. And we also have one running here in the lounge for when we have coffee hour or adult forums there. Also, you are most welcome to wear a mask at worship if you'd like.

This is the 6<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the 7-week Easter Season (a week of weeks!), and also the Sunday before the Ascension. The Ascension always occurs on a Thursday since it is 40 days after Easter, and is the last great feast before Pentecost, which is 50 days after Easter. When the disciples experience fear at the thought of Jesus leaving them (again!), Jesus explains that he must ascend to heaven so that he might send the Holy Spirit on them. Now, of course it is not the first time the Holy Spirit has come to earth. Indeed it was the creative Spirit/Wind/Breath of God that blew over the waters of chaos at the beginning of creation, that allowed God to speak creation into being, and that breathed life into human beings. The fact that we are alive and breathing means that we, like every human being, have this divine breath/Spirit within us. But what Jesus promised was something more – an indwelling of the Spirit that would empower those on whom it was poured to do even greater things than Jesus did. The Bible teaches that baptism and the receiving of this Spirit are 2 different things.

Our Wednesday Evening Bible Study has resumed and the time is now 7:00 as we study 1 Corinthians 1-4. The study is inspired by the book, <u>Basic Christian Leadership</u>: <u>Biblical Models of Church, Gospel and Ministry</u> by John Stott. As you know, Paul wrote to congregations who were facing challenges, and so we will be listening to how God is speaking to congregations today through Paul's words. This week we'll continue looking at 1 Corinthians 2. If you are interested in Salem's future, we do hope you will take this opportunity to join us!

The JOURNEY continues! How did your Lenten disciplines go? How is your Easter discipline going? Maybe you've done well, maybe you've done so-so, and maybe you've failed miserably – or maybe your results have been mixed. Whatever your success or failure, remember that the purpose is to establish NEW healthier habits of body, mind, heart and soul. And that's an ongoing task. If you've done well, continue! If you haven't, well, you've got 2 more weeks of Easter to try again! And so, you can still...

- 4. Commit yourself to some new work of charity and one new work of justice. If you're not sure what to do, Pastor Marjo can offer suggestions.

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES: Acts 17:22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god'. What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him — though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring'.

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

### A READING FROM THE BOOK OF PSALMS: Psalm 66:8-20

### A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: 1 Peter 3:13-22

Who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you — not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.
