Welcome to Worship!

We want you to feel safe so please know that we have 3 units of the best air cleaner on the market in the sanctuary. And we also have one running here in the lounge for when we have coffee hour or adult forums there. Also, you are most welcome to wear a mask at worship if you'd like.

Today we hear the good news of God's overwhelming abundance! The prophet Isaiah says that God invites all who are hungry or thirsty to receive food and drink without cost! The psalmist sings of the overflowing generosity, compassion, grace, and love of God! The apostle Paul counts the blessings that have been poured out on the beloved children of God – adoption, glory, covenants, law, worship, promises, patriarchs, and the Messiah! And with the help of his followers, Jesus feeds everyone gathered until they are full! Let us come into God's presence with thanksgiving and into God's courts with praise!

At its July meeting, Salem's Congregation Council voted to contribute \$500 to provide 1 scholarship to the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance of Greater Bridgeport's Scholarship Fund AND to encourage Salem members and friends to attend the worship service at 11:00 on Saturday the 12th of August 2023 at Russell Temple, 555 Connecticut Avenue. The mission of the IMA is to empower clergy – and their congregations – to unite and mobilize to bring about social and economic justice in the city of Bridgeport and beyond. One way we are doing this is by providing Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarships for high school graduates who are going off to colleges and universities. In 2022, 17 students each received \$500. The worship service on 8/12 will celebrate these young people's accomplishments and give thanks for all those who have supported them. I wanted to let you know that per the direction of the congregation at the semi annual meeting, we contacted Pastor Maria Hammons, the synod's Consultant for Congregational Mergers and Holy Closures; and per the direction of the council at its June meeting, we contacted Ms Kim Bergstrand, Associate to the Bishop, responsible for (among other things) Radical Revitalization and New Mission Starts. It was decided that Pastor Maria and Kim would meet together with Pastor Marjo and me, as well as Jeanette Harris, since she is already involved in mission development in Bridgeport and is closely connected with Salem.

At that meeting Pr Maria and Kim agreed to come lead an adult forum at Salem following worship and a short coffee hour on August 13th.

I hope you are as excited as I am to see where the Spirit of God is leading us!

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221 Tuesday, August 8 Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258

As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253

A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.
