Welcome to Worship!

We welcome as our supply pastor (last Sunday and today) the Rev. Peggy Yingst and we look forward to the Word of God she brings us again this week. We thank Pastor Chris Files for being on call last week, and Jeanette Harris for covering the weekday noon prayer conference line, the Wednesday noon prayer gathering, and the Wednesday 7 pm Bible Study. Pastor Marjo will return this week.

In the readings assigned for this 15th Sunday after Pentecost, we are reminded that conflict is a part of relationships and life in community. Jesus' words in today's gospel are often used in situations having to do with church discipline. The prophet Ezekiel tells of warning the wicked to turn from their ways, and Paul reminds us that love is the fulfilling of the law. We gather together to worship the Three-in-One and One-in-Three God in whom perfect unity is found, assured that Christ is present among us with the power to reconcile seemingly irreconcilable differences, and that the Spirit is present among us, continually offering us the gift of peace.

A READING FROM THE OLD TESTAMENT: Ezekiel 33:7-11

So you, mortal, I have made a sentinel for the house of Israel; whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. If I say to the wicked, "O wicked ones, you shall surely die", and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from their ways, and they do not turn from their ways, the wicked shall die in their iniquity, but you will have saved your life.

A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: Romans 13:8-14

Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet"; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, "Love your neighbor as yourself". Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.

Besides this, you know what time it is, how it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we became believers; the night is far gone, the day is near. Let us then lay aside the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us live honorably as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. Instead, put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

So far our results are as follows: 07/31 - 08/15 = 598 miles plus 08/16 - 08/30 = 599miles, for a total so far of 1197 miles! We've got one more 2-week segment to go, so cheer each of our team members on! It's not too late to register - you can still sign up for Team Salem, Bridgeport by going to https://www.calumet.org/giving/ontheroadagain and report your miles retroactively if you keep that info. If you're not a walker you can provide an Angel Donor gift by going to the same site.

John Chrysostom, Bishop of Constantinople, died 407

John was a priest in Antioch and an outstanding preacher.

His eloquence earned him the nickname "Chrysostom" ("golden mouth").

Appointed bishop of Constantinople, seat of the empire, he criticized corruption in the court. As a result, he was exiled by the empress.

Holy Cross Day

Helena, mother of Constantine,

made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and found what may be the actual site of Jesus' crucifixion. Her son built two churches there,

and the dedication of one of them gave rise to this celebration of our Lord's victory on the cross.

Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, martyr, died around 258 Saturday, September 16, 2023

Cyprian served as a bishop during a time of great persecution of Christians. He insisted on receiving back those who had left the faith under duress. He also provided medical care during a severe epidemic.
