A Special Congregational Meeting was held in October at which the congregation voted to close. On Reformation Day, United Lutheran Seminary President The Rev Dr R Guy Erwin preached and lectured at Yale Divinity School. One of the most interesting parts of the lecture and discussion was on Luther's understanding that as human beings we have two "eyes" — a physical eye and a spiritual eye.
