Welcome, everyone! And a special welcome to all those who are visiting with us today to help Pastor Marjo celebrate the 40th anniversary of her ordination. Guests and members, please stay for a time of celebration in our lounge after worship!

We welcome Pastor Gabrielle Beam as our guest preacher for today. Pastor Gabrielle is an apostolic leader who joins God where He is at work! With both her Master of Divinity and Master of Sacred Theology degrees from Yale Divinity School, she has 20 years of ministry experience. Ordained in the Anglican Church in North America, she currently serves as pastor and founder of Mary of Bethany Church, Bridgeport, Founder and Board President of Rise to Read (a 501c3 not-for-profit formed to eradicate early childhood illiteracy in urban spaces), and Founder of Saturate Bridgeport (a movement to see the Gospel of Jesus Christ presented to every person in Bridgeport). She is Chaplain of the Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance of Greater Bridgeport and a Board Member of the Council of Churches of Greater Bridgeport.

Today on All Saints Sunday as we celebrate all those living and dead who have been buried with Christ through baptism into death and raised from the dead through the glory of God that they might live a new life. It is these newly minted souls who are individually members of the Body of Christ and who together comprise the whole Christian Church that exists beyond time and space. If it were not for those who have shared their faith with us, we would not be here today. The custom of commemorating all of the saints of the church on a single day goes back at least to the third century.

A Special Congregational Meeting was held last Sunday at which the congregation voted to close. Pastor Maria Hammons will be meeting with our Executive Committee and Council at the end of this month, and plans will be made to begin the legal process of dissolution beginning in January. There are practical and legal procedures which must be followed, and as the synod leads us through these, we ask your patience and your prayers.

A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: Revelation 7:9-17

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands.

They cried out in a loud voice, saying, "Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!"

UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

John Christian Frederick Heyer, died 1873; Bartholomaeus Ziegenbalg, died 1719;

Ludwig Nommensen, died 1918; missionaries

Heyer was the first missionary sent out by American Lutherans.

After teaching at Gettysburg College and Seminary he was assigned to the Andhra region of India.

A worker among the Tamil people on the southeast coast of India, Ziegenbalg was opposed

both by local Hindus and by Danish authorities who favored a different missionary style.

He was known for caring about the welfare of the whole person.

Nommensen was born in northern Germany and was sent to Sumatra as a Lutheran missionary. Working among the Batak people, he translated the scriptures into their language, and honored their native culture.

Martin, Bishop of Tours, died 397

Martin's pagan father enlisted him in the Roman army.

Approached by a beggar, Martin cut his cloak in half and gave part to the man, whom he later understood as representing Christ. He asked to leave the army, but was jailed instead. After his release, he became a preacher, and later a bishop.

Søren Aabye Kierkegaard, teacher, died 1855

Kierkegaard was a Danish theologian whose writings also gave rise to the modern philosophy of existentialism. He frequently attacked the complacency of the state church of his day, as well as its desire to be accepted by polite society rather than be a stumbling block.
