

Welcome to Worship!

We want you to feel safe so please know that we have 3 units of the best air cleaner on the market in the sanctuary. (A big thank you to Bill Winter for getting our 3rd one repaired!). There is also one running in the lounge for when we have worship, coffee hour, or adult forums there. You are most welcome to wear a mask at worship if you'd like. And if you are a worship leader, please know that there are disposable covers for the microphone available as well.

We come here to worship and praise the God of boundless power and endless love! Every time we come in through the main doors of the church, we are reminded to "Enter into God's gates with thanksgiving and into his courts with praise" and indeed to come into God's very presence with singing. We come first to praise God for who God is and second to give thanks for what God has done, is doing, and will do. As Salem stands at this great crossroads of our history, we pray that "the LORD our God be with us, as he was with our ancestors", and that "he not leave us or abandon us, but incline our hearts to him, to walk in all his ways." And even as we pray, "we know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose" because "nothing in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord." Our worship will be followed by a time of fellowship and refreshment when you'll have the chance to renew relationships and share reminisces.







CHILDREN'S SERMON

A READING FROM THE HEBREW SCRIPTURES: I Kings 8:56-61

⁵⁶Blessed be the LORD, who has given rest to his people Israel according to all that he promised; not one word has failed of all his good promise, which he spoke through his servant Moses. ⁵⁷The LORD our God be with us, as he was with our ancestors; may he not leave us or abandon us, ⁵⁸but incline our hearts to him, to walk in all his ways, and to keep his commandments, his statutes, and his ordinances, which he commanded our ancestors. ⁵⁹Let these words of mine, with which I pleaded before the LORD, be near to the LORD our God day and night, and may he maintain the cause of his servant and the cause of his people Israel, as each day requires; ⁶⁰so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the LORD is God; there is no other. ⁶¹Therefore devote yourselves completely to the LORD our God, walking in his statutes and keeping his commandments, as at this day."

A READING FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT: Romans 8:24-39

²⁴For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. ²⁶Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

²⁸We know that all things work together for good for those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. ²⁹For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, in order that he might be the firstborn within a large family. ³⁰And those whom he predestined he also called; and those whom he called he also justified; and those whom he justified he also glorified.

³¹What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ³²He who did not withhold his own Son, but gave him up for all of us, will he not with him also give us everything else? ³³Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. ³⁴Who is to condemn? It is Christ Jesus, who died, yes, who was raised, who is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us. ³⁵Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will hardship, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ³⁶As it is written,

"For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

³⁷No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. ³⁸For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, ³⁹nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.





CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

You may stand if you so desire and make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism.

Blessed be the holy Trinity, + one God, who journeys with us these forty days, and sustains us with the gift of grace.

Amen

God's love is infinite and unconditional.

As individuals we have only to accept it and live in its light.

The moment we confess, we are forgiven.

As together we gather for worship, so together we confess our sins as our community, and together we are forgiven, restored, and made new.

Silence is kept for reflection.

Holy God,

we confess:

that too often we focus on the things we lack, that too often we are attached to our own personal agendas, that too often we insist on doing things our own way, that too often we are oblivious to the needs for justice around us.

Blessed be God, who is our Bread; may all the world be clothed and fed. Amen

We eat, not at our own table, but at the table of Christ who welcomes all – each and every one of you.

What you believe and how you receive is a matter between you and God.

According to Lutheran theology,
we teach that Christ is truly present in the gifts of this sacrament –
in the bread and wine and in the people gathered.
As we are fed by Christ's body, we become his body.
Nourished, strengthened & made whole by these gifts of God's forgiveness & grace,
we go with joy to share God's love for the world.

You may come up the center aisle and return by the side aisles.

If you prefer a prepackaged cup of grape juice with wafer on top, you may pick up one from the baskets on either side of the aisle, and stop in front of Pastor Marjo to receive the word accompanying the elements.

Or, you may receive the (gluten-free) wafer alone which Pastor Marjo will place in the palm of your hand, and then proceed to one of the people offering the chalice to intinct/dip the bread into the wine.

Those who wish to receive only a blessing may indicate their desire by crossing their arms over their hearts.

Come! The feast is ready to begin! Jesus invites you to the table!

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UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS

Dietrich Bonhoeffer, theologian, died 1945

Tuesday, April 9, 2024

Bonhoeffer was a German theologian who wrote profoundly, yet in an accessible manner. In the Second World War,

he became a leader of the Confessing Church in Germany that resisted the Nazi movement. Linked to a plot to kill Hitler, he was hanged shortly before the end of the war.

Mikael Agricola, Bishop of Turku, died 1557 Wednesday, April 10, 2024

Consecrated bishop of Turku, Finland, without the approval of the pope,

Agricola began a reform along Lutheran lines.

In only three years, he translated the New Testament and worship texts into Finnish, in the process establishing the rules of Finnish writing that are still used today.
